disposed in body but yet in perfect memory (trusting be to God) Doe by this my own hand writing and subscribed constitute &
make my last will and testament. First I give bequeath my soul to Almighty God trusting to the mercy of the passion of Jesus
Christ his only son to be one of his elect in the Kingdom of Heaven: And touching such worldly goods substance as the Lord
his blessing, me will call as yet unbestowed (my debts being paid and my finally discharged) I will to be
bestowed and distributed, in manner and form following (viz) To my well beloved wife the lease of my house in Millstreet
in London with all the implements of household stuff of myit therein contained with such small jewels of plate as I have
of myit whatsoever as yet in the custody: All which things I doe value, as by my booke appereth) (over and besides all
manner of Jewells and a great number of things as yet unwritten in any inventory to be better then two hundred
pounds and five pence. Item, more I give unto her the Summe of one hundred fifty and five pounds to be taken to
her after my debts and finally paid and discharged, which together will make the Summe of two hundred pounds
is a farre greater Summe then by the custome of this Citie of such value of substance as myit is her parte would or
should amount unto. Item, where I doe give of the assigned of Fitzard Cupper of London in the Countie of Middlesex
Esquire my house detraffed one lease of a pasture in Dorsetshire called the little house here for diverse yeares to come after
the determination or aboyding by any manner of means of a lease now in the tenure or possession of one John Dbyngton
Esquire whose yeares be aboute five yeares and a halfe to come, as by the same lease more at large it doth and maie appere,
the same lease of the same pasture as aforesaid I doe give and assign unto Thomas Carter of London my brother,
Thomas Howke of London, Merchant of the Staple, William Elwyn of Eastm. Mauditt, in the Countie of North
my brother in lawe John Carter of London, Merchant, my kinsman and to Fitzard Cupper of Stuntou Esq. in the Countie
of Salopp gent my kinsman to be bestowed in this order and effect followinge and to use or use, intente or
purpose, that is to say, To the use of me William Carter the Testator during my life, And from and after the determination
and aboyding of the said lease of the said John Dbyngton by any manner of means (then so many yeares from the tyme
of my detraff as shall accomplysh the full number of ten yeares (the said yeares of the said lease of the said John Dbyngton
beinge accompted part of the said ten yeares and fully ended) Then the whole proffitts thereof after the yeares of the said
John Dbyngton during the residue of the said ten yeares (the Rentes all wayes from tyme to tyme due to the Lord or Lords
of the Maunde reserved) To be employed to Elizabeth my wife (if she shall be longe fortime to live) towards the Education of
my children, And if she shall not live with the duratunge of my sayed children or their portions, left to that intente and

 remembrance Twentie Shillings a peere, And to my said brother hym self my best black mourninge cloake, my best fatten
 dublett and my best hose of Tufftassate, witht Jamon of saltme, and to my sister M^r wief a gowne. Item to my lobing
 Cogen M^r John Carter witht a blacke mourninge cloake, witht my bonet and amonced. Item to my godsonne John Carter his
 same for a remembrance Twentie Shillings. Item to my godsonne William Aspleston for a remembrance Twentie Shillings
 Item to the poore people, in the parish of St Mary Magdalen in Wiltshire Twentie Shillings, and to the poore childen
 in the Hospitall to be tolde to the Maister after my ffinerallye past Twentie six Shillings eight pence. Item to John
 Hatesley my ffiner Aspleston, pounded to be paid to him within one year after my decess. To my Cogen Maister Thomas
 Hatesley my Cogen M^r John Carter and to his wief every out of them a mourninge garment at the discrecion of my execut
 And wherof I did not only lose two year to myt but also wasted my substance to the balace of Twentysix pounded at
 the laste before of my great hunderdred at the leadinge and dilidinge of my brother John Woodward and
 Thomas Blakeway, in pponing me the Shopp in Charyside that Blakeway dwelled in, and after dyberst and
 poudert bargained witht them yf I had not the same to have fifty pounded of money at Blakewayes hande in yote of
 a remembrance wherof the said John Woodward toulde my wief that he must pay Twentie six pounded to me of
 yf hereafter my wief or children shall receyve or susteyne any waite for the same, wherof any maner of payd the same
 by the way of a remembrance I leave to the consideration of Almighty god to move by his mynde for remembrance and I
 for my owne doe speciallye for the same their bill dealinge towards and beinge flatlye admoored to my executor
 that they give not credit to the said John Woodward in any maner of cause touchinge either my wief or children. And
 the residue of my goodd, wherof I leave to the disposition of Elizabeth Carter my lobing wief and my lobing brother
 M^r Thomas Carter, whom I doe make and constitute my executor. And for the oversight therof I doe desire my
 brother M^r William Clynne and my Cogen M^r Thomas Hatesley indygnite of the Staple and my Cogen John
 Hatesley of London, wherof I have made newe bylls by the waye of a remembrance to be kepte
 loste duringe the life of the said William Carter the Testator or kepte from him from by any maner of meanes
 That they yf the said William Carter the Testator dothe tender unto the said Thomas Carter, Thomas Hatesley
 William Clynne John Carter and Richard Cuper or any one of them any the small Twelvinghouse situate on the west
 syde of the Rowall Exchange in London or in any other place, wherof the said William Carter shall thinke good the
 value of Twelveten pence of lawfull money of England before writen sufficient, witht any intente to frustrate this will
 and the condition therein specified That they from and after such tender made as aforesaid this will and testamant and
 all the giftes and assignmets therein specified shall be frustrate void and of none effect in the Lawe as though the said
